**Sunday, September 19** Wis 2:12, 17-20 Ps 54:3-4, 5, 6-8 Jas 3:16 – 4:3 Mk 9:30-37  
*Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time.* Jesus speaks (1, Ps) of His own rejection, torture, and shameful death. True Discipleship, He says, is concerned not with status, but with service to the poor (3), with justice and peace (2).

**Monday, September 20** Ezr 1:1-6 Ps 126:1-6 Lk 8:16-18  
*Saint Andrew Kim Tae-gon, Priest, and Saint Paul Chong Ha-sang, and Companions; Martyrs.* Through Cyrus, the Lord wills that the captives be freed (Ps) and return home to rebuild the Temple (1). The Light of Gospel Truth must shine forth through our lives (2).

**Tuesday, September 21** Eph 4:1-7, 11-13 Ps 19:2-5 Mt 9:9-13  
*Saint Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist.* Matthew (or Levi), the tax collector, is called (2) to be an Evangelist (1), to proclaim the Good News (Ps) by word and deed.

**Wednesday, September 22** Erz 9:5-9 (Ps) Tb 13:2-4, 7-8 Lk 9:1-6  
Ezra praises God for His Goodness and Pardon to sinners (1, Ps). The Twelve are sent forth to proclaim the Good News and to heal (2).

**Thursday, September 23** Hg 1:1-8 Ps 149:1-6, 9 Lk 9:7-9  
*Saint Pius of Pietrelcina, Priest.* The Lord will take delight (Ps) in the Temple which is to be rebuilt (1). Herod is perplexed by the Person of Jesus (2).

**Friday, September 24** Hg 2:1-9 Ps 43:1-4 Lk 9:18-22  
Haggai announces the hope (Ps) of the approaching Messianic Era (1). It is inaugurated in the Saving Death and Resurrection of Jesus (2).

**Saturday, September 25** Zec 2:5-9, 14-15 (Ps) Jer 31:10-13 Lk 9:43-45  
The future Temple will become a gathering place for all peoples (1, Ps). The Son of Man must suffer (2).

**Sunday, September 26** Nm 11:25-29 Ps 19:8, 10, 12-14 Jas 5:1-6 Mk 9:38-43, 45, 47-48  
*Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time.* Moses and Jesus both attest to the fact that the work of the Spirit cannot be confined by an institution, and that no one can claim a monopoly of the Spirit's charism (1, 3), or wisdom (Ps). Beware of growing rich while neglecting the rights and needs of others (2).
